FOREWORD

ISO (the International Organization for Standardization) is a worldwide federation of national standards institutes (ISO Member Bodies). The work of developing International Standards is carried out through ISO Technical Committees. International Standard ISO 1692 therefore replaces ISO Recommendation R 1692-1970 to which it is technically identical.
