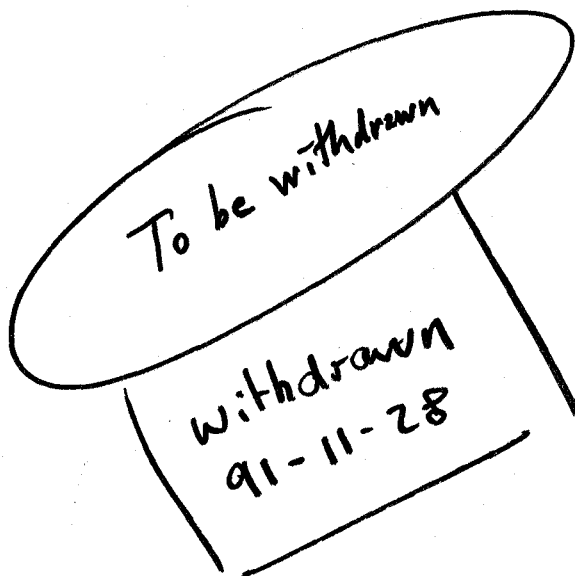

Foreword
