## Common name: diclosulam

- The word "diclosulam" (pronounced die-clow-sue-lam) has been accepted as the American National Standard Common Name for the chemical N-(2,6-dichlorophenyl)-5-ethoxy-7-= fluoro[1,2,4]triazolo[1,5-c]pyrimidine-2-sulfon= amide.
- 1.2 Acceptance signifies compliance with American National Standard Common name for a pest control chemical - Procedure for acceptance, ANSI K62.1-1985.

## 2 Use of common name

- 2.1 The common name applies to the 100% pure chemical.
- 2.2 Technical grades and formulations shall indicate the percentage of diclosulam present; for example, diclosulam 95%.
